Fans who want to be at the head of the welcoming line should plan to gather in the casino – near TGIF – no later than 7:15.





# LET'S BE SOCIAL!



## OKAY VEGAS, WHAT DO YOU REALLY THINK?

Back in January 2014, a new event arrived in Las Vegas that very few people around these parts were familiar with: the World Financial Group Continental Cup. Yes, the winter sport of curling – and at the highest level, no less – was coming to the desert, of all places.

At first blush, it seemed like a mismatch. But thousands upon thousands of curling fans traveled to Vegas for that inaugural international curling event at Orleans Arena. It was such a smash success that the Continental Cup returned in 2016 and 2017, and last year, the World Men's Curling Championship came to town.

Now, the Continental Cup is back. And while that surely means a whole lot of travelers will be here, as well – particularly our maple syruploving Canadian friends – it also means locals get another dose of an event and a sport they're growing to love. And Las Vegans are excited about it.

"I love it. I think it's awesome," said local sports columnist Ron Kantowski, who has covered every event under the sun in his three decades in the desert. "Some call it chess on ice. I call it Canadian bowling, because it just seems like a sport you can do while you're drinking a beer, like bowling. And that's not to denigrate it at all. I think it's really cool."

Boyd Gaming and Orleans Arena took a leap of faith on curling in 2013, securing the 2014 Continental Cup, and that faith was rewarded with sellout crowds at sessions throughout the four-day tournament. Rex Berman, the arena's executive director, echoed Kantowski's enthusiasm and pointed to the event's unique format – borrowed a bit from the sport of golf.

"The Continental Cup is tremendously exciting because it's way more than just an average competition," Berman said. "Team World competes against Team North America in a Ryder Cup-style format. Whoever has the most points at the end of the final draws takes home the cup. The event provides the opportunity for teams to experiment with new game variations that could be seen at future Olympic Games, like mixed doubles, for example."

Berman also pointed to curling in general and the Continental Cup in specific as being very fan- and family-friendly. Your pocketbook isn't going to burst from the cost of tickets for this event. Berman and event organizers have gone to great lengths to make the Continental Cup as accessible as possible, particularly for locals.

"The event is family-friendly and connects the community to an Olympic-level sport that people may not otherwise have the opportunity to see live," Berman said. "Family Fun Zone ticket packages are available at the Orleans Arena, which allow families to get close to the action at a reduced ticket price."

Efforts such as that have certainly helped the Continental Cup gain a following here in the Las Vegas Valley. For evidence of that, look no further than a drawing that was held for tickets to take in Saturday's draws. The Las Vegas Review-Journal sponsored a contest to give away family four-packs of tickets to 10 winners.

The response to the contest, which ended last week, was overwhelming, according to Cass Behrens, who as a multimedia account executive at the Review-Journal oversees several such promotions.

"We had 1,100 entries, which is pretty significant for our contests," Behrens said. "There was a ton of engagement, which is great to see. To my surprise, people were very, very excited."

Lisa Motley, director of sports marketing and special events for the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority, couldn't wait to get elite-level curling back in Las Vegas for the fifth time in the last six years. Sure, everybody's talking about the Vegas Golden Knights and the future arrival of the NFL's Raiders, but this event is now an important staple on the LVCVA's calendar.

"With a growing roster of A-list games and activities, Las Vegas has quickly transformed into the ultimate sports haven, and we are once again thrilled to add the Continental Cup to that lineup," Motley said. "Curling events have experienced great success here, so it's really no surprise Las Vegas continues to be the only U.S. city to host the Continental Cup."

Motley certainly appreciates the opportunity this event provides for locals to get a much closer experience with an Olympic sport. At the same time, it's her job to attract people to Vegas from all over the globe, and this event certainly does that, particularly with the flood from north of the border.

"Canada is our No. 1 source of international visitors, with more than 1.4 million traveling here every year," Motley said. "This event provides yet another great opportunity to travel to sunny Las Vegas during the cold winter and witness a top-notch sporting event."

Behrens pointed out that even if you have limited or no knowledge of curling, you'll find the Continental Cup to be quite engaging. His first experience with the sport came last year at the World Men's Curling Championships, which he said was very well-received in the community.

Part of that, rightly so, was because American John Shuster and his team were fresh off a surprise gold-medal victory at the Olympics. But the contest response shows that the enthusiasm for curling in Vegas surely hasn't waned and in fact is growing.

"It seems like there's just as much excitement this year, and I thought the event last year was highly successful," Behrens said. "Last year was the first time I ever attended a curling event. It was highly entertaining and interesting. It's completely different being there in person, to see how the event is put on, with three matches going at the same time. And the fans really get into it. It's a really fun environment."


Kantowski, who will take in his second Continental Cup and was at the World Championships last year, can certainly vouch for that. He fondly – and hysterically – recalled his first experience with live curling, in 2017.

"The first Continental Cup I went to, the matches started at an ungodly hour, like 9 a.m., and the place was packed and the fans were totally stoked," Kantowski said. "It looked like Gonzaga vs. Brigham Young in the West Coast Conference basketball tournament. You've got fans with a Molson in one hand and a Tim Horton's doughnut in the other hand. I thought, 'What a great sport. Drinking beer, having a doughnut and watching curling at 9 a.m!"

It's a spectacle that you've got to see to believe, and to fully enjoy. If you immerse yourself in it, even as a novice fan, you're bound to have a hellacious time this weekend at Orleans Arena.

"If you've never seen it in person, you need to. You really get into it. It's much better in person than on TV," Kantowski said, noting he's so hooked that he'd be tempted to pull up stakes from Vegas – for a few cold days anyway – to see more of it. "Send me to Winnipeg!"
